

Terms and Conditions – Processing of Personal Data

In accordance with Law No. 29733 – Personal Data Protection Act (the “Act”) and its Regulations, Supreme Decree No. 003-2013/JUS (the “Regulations”), I hereby give my previous, free, express and unambiguous consent so that RIMAC Seguros y Reaseguros (hereinafter, RIMAC) may process the physical or digital personal data I may provide to it (the “Personal Data”) in order to perform any contractual relationship I currently have and/or will have in the future with RIMAC, as well as for statistical and/or analytical and/or client behavior purposes and/or for RIMAC’s evaluation of the quality of the product or service provided. I certify that I am aware of my right to revoke this consent at any time.

I certify that I have been informed that, in accordance with the Act and the Regulations, my Personal Data will be stored, during my contractual relationship with RIMAC and for up to ten (10) years after termination thereof, at the Client Data Bank held by RIMAC, located at Av. Paseo de la República 3505 Piso 11 – San Isidro, Lima, and registered with the National Registry of Personal Data Protection under the name “Clients”, with code RNPDP-PJP N° 1637.

I further certify that I am aware of my right to request access to my Personal Data and to be informed on how they are being processed; to request their updating, inclusion, rectification, cancellation and deletion; and to oppose to their use or disclosure, through any RIMAC’s Attention Platforms. Additionally, I am aware that I can seek protection of my rights by filing a claim with the National Personal Data Protection Authority or by filing a habeas data action with the Judiciary.
